The Advent Wreath will be used at Masses to remind us of the new liturgical year now beginning.

Please note that the Weekend Readings now come from Year B and the Weekday Readings will be taken from Year 1 unless there is a Feast Day being observed.

Looking further ahead after much thought and prayer I have taken the reluctant decision that there will not be a 'live' Mass on Christmas Day in Our Lady's or St.Cuthbert's. I am concerned that more people would be turned away if they arrive without warning or do not comply with the booking requirements in place at the moment. It would mean I would be saying no to more people than those currently come to Mass. That is not what I would like to be doing on Christmas Day. I do not think we would be able to manage safely given the restrictions that apply. Likewise the Churches would need to be cleaned before the normal weekend Masses which will take place as usual. I know this decision will be upsetting and disappointing to some of you as it is to me. But equally I hope you will understand why it is being done. It is for your safety and protection and also to avoid turning people away. A Christmas Mass will be recorded in advance and then streamed for as many people to join it

as want to at a time that suits them and at home. As I said it a decision I have taken with a heavy heart and I hope you will accept it as such.

Congratulations to those who made their First Communion on 28<sup>th</sup> November. They are a credit to themselves, their families and the school. Many thanks to all helped make it a special day.

## First Reconciliations Update (Current P4 Pupils Only) – Please Book Now for December 2020

Parents/Carers of pupils who were in P3 last year and should have celebrated their First Reconciliation in March 2020, will have the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament in December: between the dates of Saturday 5th and Saturday 12th December. Parents/carers can select either a Saturday or weeknight slot by contacting Fr Duffy on 0131 443 1317 or staned@stcuthbertschurch.com to arrange a time for this sacrament to be celebrated. Over 50% of parents/carers have now contacted Fr Duffy. Thanks for this, please do so in the coming weeks, if you haven't had the chance to do so already.

\*Please note that any pupil wishing to celebrate their First Holy Communion in 2021 must have also made their First Reconciliation.

Thankfully, there are still no changes in restrictions for celebrating Mass. That does not mean we can afford to drop our guard and it is even more important however we maintain the rules and restrictions laid down by both the Government and the Church authorities and not ease off our efforts. Some are definitely beginning to lower their guard. Please remember that due to the additional 'check in' time needed please do not leave it until the last minute before you arrive. Arriving those few minutes early also provides an opportunity for private personal prayer while waiting for Mass to begin. As we still live with the effects of Covid, there is a risk of physical and spiritual fatigue. Perhaps we have become weary of all sorts of guidelines and simply want to push them to the back of our mind or worse still and potentially more dangerous ignore them completely to suit ourselves. We may be struggling with how we pray and how we can live our Christian lives. Please comply with the restrictions as outlined. I have noticed that the standards are slipping a bit as time goes on especially in terms of

Physical Distancing: This is an area where people are beginning to sit closer than they should. There must be a 2 meter distance minimum between parishioners to enable the maximum people to come and be safe. The 2 meter distancing is not an option. It is a legal requirement. The point of having designated places in the church is to help limit the risk of infection. Everyone should remain in their seat when they are shown to it. It is a temptation to go and talk to someone we haven't seen for a while, but that defeats the safety aim of set seating. There must be a 2 metre minimum distance unless you are there as a family group.

**Observing the One-Way-System:** You will be led to your seats. Please do not bring food or toys to Mass with you. I would also ask parents to stop their children from moving around during Mass.

**For your own safety and well being** please follow the directions of the Passkeepers especially when coming forward for Holy Communion. Please do not leave your seat until you are asked to do since this can compromise the 2 metre social distancing. You should also leave the Church immediately after receiving Communion following the one way system.

You should not return to your seat again to maintain social distancing and make it possible for the area to be wiped down after each Mass. If you wish a blessing instead of

Communion follow the same route as those receiving communion. Thank you very much to those who have been involved so far in cleaning the Church and also escorting parishioners to the allocated seats.

**Remaining after Mass:** As noted above, the seats are sanitised after each Mass so that means that we need to ask everyone to leave the church straight away after receiving Holy Communion and not return to their seats. This applies to weekday and weekend Masses

Please remember you must book each week if you intend coming and at the moment to allow a fair distribution for Mass, booking is restricted to one booking per Mass per household with a maximum of four people and you cannot sit where you wish.

The number of committed volunteers is dropping off significantly and it may be that we will not be able to cope with the cleaning required. This could mean that Masses will have to be cancelled.
